obstruct footpaths. There were no other updates on the remaining items in the Clerk's report.

Cllr Thornhill reported that the OPCC Safer Roads Grant had been submitted by the deadline but with Shropshire Council having failed to honour the commitment made previously by the leader of the council, Lezley Picton, to confirm their authorisation of the proposals. He reported on his further engagement with Shropshire Council officers, and sought and was given support from members to continue pursuing the matter with Shropshire Council.

After noting income received and resolving payments, members agreed to support a planning application for replacement windows. Members also considered whether to send any comments to the Planning Inspectorate on the environmental impacts of the Green Gen Vynwy Frankton Project. Members resolved to not comment at this stage and wait for the second formal consultation, when specific locations would be known.

Members agreed to accept the quote from Tim Simmons, of Shropshire Council, for the footpath to the new accessible play equipment. There were some issues that needed to be resolved about the surface type, which was deferred to the next meeting when more information would be available.

The Clerk had received a letter from Helen Morgan MP about the flooding issue on Ralph's drive. As chair I have spoken to affected residents and mapped the area to assess the flooding. My survey and assessment, as a Chartered Civil Engineering Surveyor, was included in the Clerk's reply. Members agreed to send the Clerk's draft reply setting out the Parish Council's views on the matter.

Our next meeting (at the time of writing) on the 12th of March will consider a number of items ranging from insurance and policy renewals to sorting final details for the Parish's Annual Parish Meeting. Members will be considering recommendations from David Woodhouse about possible applications for Tree Preservation Orders.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be at West Felton CE Primary School on Thursday 18 April at 7:30pm. The Clerk, at the request of members, has managed to arrange Helen Morgan MP as the guest speaker.

Our next Parish Council meeting is on 9 April 2024 at 7:30pm in West Felton CE Primary School.



West Felton Methodist Chapel

How do you begin to sum up 115 years of the Chapel? Having lived in the village and attended the chapel for only 17 years, there will be many of you reading this who have many more memories than I – either of attending chapel itself or the Sunday School.

There have been many over the years who worked tirelessly for the Chapel – names some of us can put faces to, and others who are long gone but who still have family living in the parish. We still have 3 members whose combined membership exceeds 150 years – that is Dorothy Barnes, Doreen Catchpole and Eileen Hanmer. We will never know the Christian influence the members of the Chapel had on the people of West Felton.

I hear stories of the Sunday School outings to Rhyl and the services when the chapel was full – neither of which now occur. Whereas years ago most children attended Sunday School, few churches now run them; similarly attending church (of whatever denomination) is not a part of modern life, and we are not the only church whose closure is a consequence of this.

One thing that has remained constant is the raising of funds for various projects such as the building of the schoolroom, the purchasing of the organ and latterly the new large window of the chapel – just to name but a few. They would not have been achievable without the support of those in the village and those connected to West Felton.

And here we must thank all those who have supported us so well over the years — either by making donations or supporting the various events put on by chapel members. Obviously over recent years the coffee mornings and concerts have been our fund raisers, but in the past there were many ways of raising funds.

For 12 months or more now there have just been 8 members. Under new rules of the Methodist Church we would no longer be able to be a stand-alone church. However, the members took the decision last year that we could no longer keep the chapel building in good order and as a consequence would no longer be able to keep the chapel building open. We wanted the decision to be ours rather than closure be forced upon us.

This is not just closing a building, this is our place of worship – where we meet as a family of Christ to seek guidance and strength and to praise together, to support each other and care for one another. So please remember us in your prayers and think of us as we find new places to worship.

Our final 'normal' service will be on Easter Day at 11 a.m., and our closing service is on Sunday, 7th April at 2.30 p.m. Both are open to all who wish to join us.





Times have changed at the Parochial Church in West Felton

On April 5th 1923, almost one hundred years ago, 27 people sat down to listen to, and comment upon, the proceedings of the Annual assembly of the Parochial church in West Felton. Nineteen men and eight women were present. Two churchwardens for the Parish church and 2 for St Chad's were appointed, together with 10 sidesmen for the church and 7 for St Chad's. PCC members included J Withers Edwards, Withers being a long standing name in the parish, and featuring on an 18th century charity board in the church. The Electoral roll contained 318 names. the roll requiring 10 people to keep it up to date. Four Committees, Finance, Fabric, Women's and Library, assisted the Parochial church council run the church. The Fabric committee was given the rôle of running the Haslehurst Institute. The women's committee was thanked for its work in maintaining the church clothing and linen; a subcommittee was formed to build up the Sunday school, teachers for which were required. Although a Library committee was elected, there is no record of what it did.

Other references were made to two men's groups. One was the Church of England Men's society which met at the home of Mr Bradley at Stonehouse. This society was a relatively recent group started in 1899 by Archbishop Frederick Temple, father of William Temple the Archbishop of Canterbury

who played an important role in setting up the education act of 1944. The Church of England men's society provoked criticism for getting involved in discussions on divorce and resisting the force feeding of suffragettes. The second group was a young men's Club which met in the Haslehurst Institute and had a membership of 43.

Finance inevitably occupied much of the report. At the time there were no less than four accounts and funds served by two treasurers. Equal oversight was not however attributable to all accounts. There was a general account which included special offertories, an altar and sick fund which was under the control of the Rector (and which was to cause some upset a decade later), a St Chad's fund and a free will offering fund. Figures given below are to the nearest pound and £1 in 1923 is worth £73 today.

General fund collections came to £104 in one year from 45 offertories and there was £38 from free will offerings. Of this £29 was spent on the choir and organ. £42 on a new boiler and £32 on work done by the sexton and others. Coal cost £13 and a church cleaner £10. The church was insured for £6000 and required a premium of just over £5. A further £62 was collected for such worthy causes as waifs and strays and local hospitals. At that time the Rector received his income from tithe, not from the parish share. The Altar fund had receipts from services on early communion on Sundays, Saints days and

It's not too late to help with our Bird Survey, and Save our Curlews

The first Curlews returning to the area to breed were heard in early March. Have you been lucky enough to see or hear any yet? If so, please let us know.

Our area extends from Oswestry in the north to Kinnerley in the south, and eastward from the Welsh border to Ruyton-XI-Towns.



The survey only involves three 3-hour visits, between the beginning of April and mid-June, simple instructions and a map to record your observations are provided, and there will be a training session if you want to come.

Our bird survey is the first stage of the Save our Curlews project, as it locates the pairs of Curlews to focus the efforts of the nest-finders. Surveyors are not expected to look for nests.

week day communions. The Rector distributed all the proceeds. St Chad had its own accounts and had an income from services of £79 for the preceding year. Additionally a bequest of £100 was received and free will offering including subscriptions totalled £64. Expenses included £7-10s for a church cleaner and 15 shillings for a cleaner at Grimpo school. Care of the churchyard cost £3, coal £3 and a set of new chairs was purchased for £12. Other significant costs included £35 for a new organ, £38 for a new boiler and £19 to the Diocesan fund.

From the accounts it is not easy to compare the income from equivalent sources at the two churches. However collections at the main church services and 'subscriptions' came to £118 at St Chad's and £142 at the parish church. Of all income from both churches excluding bequests, St Chad's produced about one third of total parish income. Of the income from the Parish church that appeared in the accounts about 17% was spent on charitable donations.

Commenting on the church's finances, the Rector, Rev Frank Taylor, estimated that £600 -19s-2d had been collected for church activities from all sources in the parish. He concluded by saying: "Evidently if the material affairs of the church were a true index of the spiritual side of the church's work our parish would indeed be in a healthy condition and fulfilling its primary object".

The Annual assembly of the Parochial church is now called the Annual Parochial church meeting (APCM). It is open to everyone in the parish.

Should you wish to come and compare the results for 2023 with those of 1923, please come to the 2024 APCM which be on Wednesday 17th April at 7.30pm in St Michael's Church West Felton.








Do the Garden Path with Topiarius

The height of spring

For as long as we have grown vegetables it has been our practice to sow peas at the beginning of April. But not this year as an earth shattering decision was made that we would no longer bother with growing our own peas. This was on the grounds that they are lot of hassle for a modest yield that has to be picked at just the right time. The farmers do it perfectly well. However, that won't detract a great deal from April being the busiest month for seed sowing. Our list includes nine varieties of bedding and hardy annuals, tomato, cucumbers, potatoes, broad beans, radish, courgette, squash, watercress, carrots, sprouts and sprouting broccoli. That will keep us busy enough before we get to attending to grass and waging war on weeds.

Early in the month is a good time to apply lawn sand and resow any thin or bare patches in the grass. Also at this time, I apply a general feed (Growmore) to vegetables, fruit and flower beds. If you have a rotation plan for vegetables and use a frame to keep pigeons off your brassica, now is the time to move it to its new position.

The mention of crop rotation reminds me that Charles Dowding of no dig fame has questioned the need for this practice. It is based on the two factors of preventing build up of pests and diseases and plants having different food needs, and was developed for farming

rather than small scale gardening. Dowding has not had problems with a little or no rotation approach and argues that in a small space rotation is not really possible, while intercropping and successive crops on the same land rather negate the practice. Additionally, his no dig methods involve the use of a lot of organic material, far more than in farming, which will have a large effect on fertility.

I have always followed the traditional approach and practiced rotation but on a three year basis as that suited my space and range of vegetables. I shall continue to do this as I find it convenient and my situation is not complicated by intercropping or a very small space. Also, I am not able to apply the same quantities of organic matter as Dowding does and strongly suspect that rotation is helpful to maintain a balanced fertility. However, I can see the merits of his reasoning and certainly don't believe that my rotation is effective in warding off pests. In a very small space, there really is no choice.

In the gardening seasons calendar, February is considered to be late winter and March is early spring. It then follows that April is mid spring and, consequently, it should not be in the least surprising that it is the top month for sowing. However, caution has to be exercised because spring does not mean warm and in Shropshire we have to expect frost well into May. •



What's in a name? Unpopular old title was cheerfully ditched

NOSTALGIA

When Shropshire was establishing a county council in 1888 the decision was made to call it Salop County Council.

An old Times article noted: "There was no record of why the

name Salop County Council was adopted" – and we can't work it out either. A campaign in 1980, led by a retired Army officer, to re-name Salop to Shropshire received overwhelming public support.

In 1979 Colonel John Kenyon, a county councillor from West Felton, argued the history of the county was under threat.

He said: "We Shropshire men and women are in danger of losing our county's true identity. This is being done by the hasty whim of a bureaucratic machine which has in no way taken into account the traditions, history and wishes of the people of Shropshire."

Reportedly another reason why Salop was unfavourable was a fear of being laughed at by the French.

If you add the letter 'E' it becomes the French word for a rather derogatory term.

So on March 1, 1980, an overwhelming majority of 48 to five councillors voted to officially bid farewell to Salop.

The name change came into effect a few weeks later, on April 1, 1980.

Salop County Council was based at Shrewsbury's old Shirehall, which stood in The Square, until the new Modernist building opened in 1967.
