**Flooding in West Felton.** The recent bad weather has had an adverse impact and the Council will consider the problem, possible causes, and how we can best assist residents affected. ♦

In his latest newsletter Police and Crime Commissioner, John Campion, amongst many other initiatives, particularly stated that, "Improving safety on our roads and reducing the harm caused on them is another key element within my plan. (Continued from page 37) Value of a Church ing that the church was there and represented a cohesive force for families and villages. The church is, as the sociologist David Martin wrote, "a visible sign of continuity, (an) anchor of space and time". Families would tend to support the church. Competition arose between local churches in order to ensure that 'your' church did not let the side down.

With farms becoming bigger and equipment more specialised, the families that supported the community and the tradesmen, with the skills that they gave to the area, declined. The new inhabitants who replaced the old families had less reason to support the church. Many may only stay in a community for a short time before their occupation takes them elsewhere. The affection for the church fades, although the mention of a church in an estate agent's brochure may have a positive effect on house prices. In the face of these challenges the role of the country church becomes less distinct. the planning process has been com-They may host other enterprises such as shops or post offices, but their architecture with high ceilings does not lend itself to comfort.

Any change, be it the pencil chewing churchwarden at one extreme to the builder wishing to convert the church to another use at the other, is imme-

diately brought up against planning regulations. Churches are often listed buildings. This usually means that anything that might be done is going to cost a great deal more in order to satisfy all the interested bodies such as English Heritage and the Victorian society. All usually have expensive recommendations. Unlike France where the state has responsibility for churches, although church and state were separated in 1905, the British government has no responsibility for churches. Even worse it is likely that the present government will abolish the right to claim back VAT on any church repairs. There are charities which help with preservation of churches although most expect the local church to raise 50% minimum of the total cost.

St Michael's, in common with many churches, is in need of maintenance. The cost is likely to exceed £40,000 (including VAT) by the time the necessary architect has overlooked all the application and advised on the methods and materials to be used, pleted and the necessary quotes obtained. And then comes the matter of writing to charities to ask for their help. The repairs to St Michael's may come to 0.005% of the cost of the repairs to Notre Dâme, but it still seems a lot of money. ♦

## VALUE OF A CHURCH?

#### Michael Davie

As a churchwarden chews the end of his pencil wondering what to enter into the various boxes of the Diocesan faculty form, a necessary prelude to any church repairs, he is inevitably given to wonder what is the value of a church. He is not alone in this. Many wardens looking after grade II\* listed churches have similar feelings as they struggle not only to complete the form – even to the extent of specifying the mix of lime mortar required – but also to contemplate whence the money to do the repairs will be found.

Unsurprisingly given recent news items, his mind turned to Notre Dâme which was recently fully restored within a five year period after a disastrous fire. Three items took his attention. First, the French state immediately said that it would be rebuilt and underwrote the cost. Even more fortunate was that money flowed in from around the world to meet the eventual cost of around £800m. Finally the whole restoration was done in 5 years. Such a time span would be unthinkable in this country. It would take longer than that the get the planning permission.

There are those who feel that church buildings detract from what we should be worshipping. Evangelicals are not particularly attracted to

buildings, citing the words of St Paul 'Ye are the body of Christ and members in particular' and '.we being many are one body in Christ, and every one member of another'. The remarkable response to the destruction of Notre Dâme does nevertheless reveal the feeling that a building is a potent symbol. Buildings are seen as a witness to a Higher Authority, not only in the Christian religion, but in others such as the Sikh Gurdwara, the Muslim Mosque and the Jewish Temple. Church buildings do attract people, often the more ornate the greater the attraction. In England cathedrals are one of the few Christian venues actually showing an increase in attendances.

Country churches, standing serenely over a churchyard, filled with gravestones dating back centuries often evoke long memories in local people. Urban churches, which may be lost amidst a welter of shops and businesses make a lesser impression, though their interiors may be no less beautiful. The country church used to draw its strength from the support of the local community, many families of which had been living in the area for centuries. Successive generations had been baptised, confirmed, married in church and relations contributed to the inhabitants of the churchyard. There was a feel-

Sp the Garden Path with Topiarius

#### Winter winds

Some years ago, I remarked that there seemed to have been more windy days than usual. The last couple of years has certainly confirmed that suspicion, at least for where I garden. In the last two autumn storms. I was somewhat surprised, but much relieved, that we only suffered minor damage as I was convinced that we must lose at least a part of a large tree. However, even minor damage adds to the work load and we had more than enough small branches to clear up as well as wayward pots to retrieve. If indeed there is an increase in strong winds, what does it mean for the gardener? By far the biggest thing would be increased risk of structural damage, but it also means that we might need to pay more attention to staking vulnerable plants and perhaps give thought to deliberately introducing tough plants to act as windbreaks. Or perhaps the plants will react by stiffening their resolve.

The first jobs for February will be to keep out of the wind and anything else nasty the weather may throw at us and do the glasshouse spring cleaning, even if it is not actually spring. There is a feeling of satisfaction in seeing everything tidy, no cobwebs and clean glass. With that done, my attention will turn to sharpening tools. I see this as being divided into two groups: the really sharp tools such as knives and secateurs and the relatively blunt things like

spades and hoes. You possibly could need to start with a grindstone for badly damaged cutting instruments but generally they can be dealt with using a whetstone or a diamond coated sharpening tool. Nowadays, I usually use a diamond tool. Incidentally, whet does not mean wet but is from the old English meaning to sharpen or encourage. I like the idea of encouraging the tools. Spades and hoes are readily dealt with using a flat file but there are some designs of hoe that need a rather large round file. I find that axes fall a bit between the two types as they should be fairly sharp but usually need some surgery from a file or grindstone. Perhaps I illtreat mine.

People vary somewhat in their opinion as to when garlic should be planted with many favouring Autumn. However, I have usually been of the Spring brigade but this year will go for early February, which in a sense is a compromise between the two. Again, I will be planting cloves in 11 cm plastic rings (cut from drain pipe) filled with compost as I have found this to work well for avoiding fungal diseases.

As the month progresses, the spring cleaning can progress outside to clearing debris from paths and tidying pots. It will then be time to cut out autumn raspberry canes and set mouse traps in the glasshouse if not done already. It is nearly spring so review the actions from the July assessment. ♦

## Oswestry and Borders Foodbank Helping local people in crisis

The Oswestry and Borders food bank made 215 Christmas hampers filled with food goodies, toiletries, gifts and toys as well as treats for pets. They were made as bespoke as possible and were all collected by agencies and schools: agencies such as housing, family nurses, health visitors, Early Help teams and social workers. Every hamper had supermarket vouchers included, either from Morrisons for Oswestry families or Tesco if they lived in Ellesmere and surrounding area. The vouchers ranged from £10 for a single person to £50 for a family of 9 +.

Whilst the hampers were being made by volunteer teams at Cabin lane, the foodbank continued to be operated for emergency food parcels, led by the deputy manager Susannah. The volunteers have worked incredibly hard and have made up hundreds of emergency food packs in the last couple of weeks alone and the support services have been greatly in demand in number 58 - Samaritans, Women's Aid, Citizens Advice and mental health.

Our building number 58 is key to helping people move out of the situations they find themselves in and there have been some real achievements in this.

# Important information for dog walkers

Bag your dog's poo, and place it in a bin or take it home.



Make sure your dog is on a lead on the public highway.



Ensure your dog is always under control.

Keep your dog out of fenced play or sports areas.

A public spaces protection order (PSPO) is now in place across the Shropshire Council area to help tackle the problem of dog fouling and bad behaviour.

Under the PSPO the above can all be enforced and fixed penalty notices of £100 can be issued to dog walkers who allow a dog to foul pavements and public amenity spaces without clearing up afterwards.
