PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Cllr John Thornhill, Chairman

Neighbourhood Plan. Council agreed that it was still in favour of further investigating the publication of such a plan, but agreed to defer discussion until the March meeting in view of political uncertainties.

Puffin Crossing on Holyhead Road. A proposal for such a crossing on the main road was considered and the necessary criteria for an application were discussed. It was agreed that it was unlikely those criteria would be met. Concerns were expressed for pedestrian safety on Holyhead Road during closure and diversion of the A5 and it was agreed to approach the police for support and advice. They reported that if there was an incident resulting in the closure of the A5 with a diversion, the police would be fully involved in the incident and managing the flow of traffic at the scene.

Football pitch. The Clerk has contacted the agent who manages the land onto which it was proposed to lay a football pitch to enquire as to whether the land owner would be willing to let the Parish Council have some sort of control over the land. After three reminders we have received, very recently, a response stating, "My clients are considering the proposal, and I will be back in touch in due course."

Conservation Area signs. In response to the Council's request for the erection of signs identifying the Conservation area an on-line meeting was held with Shropshire Council's road manager. We have since been provided with a recommended supplier and the road manager also commented. "Unfortunately, I'm still stumped for the best location for an entry sign at the western extents due to the lack of available verge/ footways. May I suggest a site visit for this location to check on any potential locations." Council discussed this matter and felt that such a sign could be placed on The Avenue at the end furthest away from the village. This will be conveyed to the road manager with a request for a site visit to also incorporate the erection of speed indication signs at various places in the village - a request made in July 2023 and not yet undertaken!

Community Speed Watch. We still need volunteers to enable this scheme to be fully effective. If you would be interest please let the Clerk know.

Rednal Airfield Battery Energy Storage System. There has been some concern expressed about the proposed plans presented by Elmya RPC to develop and deliver a 300MW BESS at Rednal Airfield. The Council did not receive any direct contact from the company and the consultation period for $14^{th}-28^{th}$ Jan was after the January meeting. Papers were sent to individual councillors for personal responses. In correspondence the company representative was informed that if it would like to speak at one of our council meetings prior to submission of the planning application they would be welcome to do so, but no one attended the February meeting. Once a planning application has been submitted then it will be sent to the Council for consideration, comment and our approval or otherwise. If anyone wishes to make representations then the March meeting will be held on Tues 11^{th} March at West Felton Primary School.

School parking – There has been further correspondence re the parking at the School and the removal of the cardboard police officer. The school has purchased a replacement. We also approached the police who responded by saying 'We are aware of the parking issues in and around the West Felton Primary School, and we have been in attendance to the school and surrounding area several times, including today to help alleviate this. We have taken with us some of the attached leaflets to put on offending cars, as well as speaking to drivers about their parking.' At our meeting the local police officer discussed the matter in detail with the Council. Elsewhere in this edition is an article from the police explaining the situation and actions that have and may be taken. We are grateful to the many parents who use the pub car park and walk the short distance to the school. Please be considerate when dropping off your children and remember that we should park at least 10 metres (32 feet) away from any junction, close to the kerb, and facing in the direction of the traffic flow.

Public Spaces Protection Order (dog fouling). 24 posters have been requested and Cllr Hesketh has now collected the posters from Shropshire Council. You will see these being put up around the village in the next few (Continued on page 9)

Flooding in West Felton. The Council wrote to John Bellis of Shropshire Council to express unease regarding continued flooding following the installation of a ditch to alleviate flooding at the Tedsmore Road development. The Council had previously raised concern with the developers that the proposed ditch might resolve the flooding on Ralph's Drive, but was likely to result in increased flood risk downstream. It was also made clear at the time that it did not support the proposal as a means of alleviating the flooding. We pointed out that with the recent inclement weather our playing field, adjacent to the development, which has not historically had any flooding issues, is now regularly flooded, as is The Smithy. When the flooding occurs, the owner of The Smithy is unable to get her car off the property or go to work. A response was received which stated 'Shropshire Council are aware of the flooding. Following the last event our tanker team jetted the highway drain under Holyhead Road which appeared to clear a blockage which then drained the flood. We are now looking to arrange a CCTV survey of this section of drain to see if there is a defect causing the issue. I believe this is programmed for next week. $(12^{th} - 16^{th})$

Council will wait until it receives the results of the survey before we respond any further.

Footbridge over A5 at Fox Lane. It has been reported that due to the bad weather access across the bridge has become more difficult. We have contacted Shropshire Council to ask them to implement the promise they gave five years ago to re-surface it.

Annual Parish Meeting. It is proposed to hold this meeting on Tuesday 20th May 2025 at 7 30pm in the School. More details will be available nearer the date.

Next Parish Council meeting - 11 March, at 7.30 pm in the hall of West Felton CE Primary School. Each meeting has an Open Forum or Public Session at the start of the meeting in which members of the public may bring items of interest or concern to the attention of the Council. ◆

Tanat to Perry Community Wildlife Group

Please help with our Bird Survey, and Save our Curlews

If you would like to do something to help stop Curlew and

Lapwing disappearing from the local countryside, or you just enjoy going out to look for them, we would like your help, please.

Last year, we found 5 – 6 pairs of Curlew, and several pairs of Lapwing.

We are repeating our bird survey to look for them again, starting at the end of March. If you can recognise Lapwing and Curlew (and preferably their calls), you can make an important contribution. If possible, we'd also like you to record Kestrel, Cuckoo, and Red Kite, please, but that's an optional extra.

Our area extends from Oswestry in the north to Kinnerley in the south, and eastward from the Welsh border to Ruyton-XI-Towns.

The survey only involves three 3-hour visits, between the beginning of April and mid-June, simple instructions and a map to record your observations are provided, and there will be a training session if you want to come.

Our bird survey is the first stage of the Save our Curlews project, as it locates the pairs of Curlews to focus the efforts of the nest-finders. Surveyors are not expected to look for nests.

Save our Curlews

Together with the Three Parishes Community Wildlife Group (which covers Weston Rhyn, St Martin's and Gobowen), we will be working again with Shropshire Ornithological Society's Save our Curlews Campaign, which aims to find as many nests as possible, protect them from predation and trampling with an electric fence, then fix a radio tag to the chicks that hatch and track them to see how they use the landscape, and what happens to them. Finding out why breeding productivity is so poor is key to working out an effective conservation plan.

Meeting A meeting will be held on Wednesday 12th March at 7.30pm at Morda Social Club, Weston Road, Morda, SY10 9NS, to present the results of our work in previous years, and consider plans for 2025. March means plants

March signals the approach of Spring plant buying time. We buy a few varieties of bedding as plug plants to lessen the work needed for raising from seed. They were ordered a long time back but I would expect at least some to be still available. We usually plan our nursery visits to be towards the end of March but just before Easter—when nurseries have stocked up in readiness for everybody getting spring fever over the holiday. Easter is very late this year so that means plants should be a bit more advanced.

Those who breed and sell plants have to do their best to make their products attractive to you—and they have the name, the description and the picture to play with. You probably first see the picture which I suspect is often enhanced to exaggerate colour and size. The description is highly likely to emphasise good points and perhaps not mention that the plant is borderline hardy or only flowers for a few days. If you are at home looking at a catalogue, you can check several sources using Google and the like (maybe ChatGPT these days). If you are at the nursery, it is much easier to be seduced.

Then the name. I bet we have all at some time bought plants simply because the name was irresistible. I certainly confess to getting the rose Tottering-by-Gently on the basis it must be as good as the cartoons. Roses generally do well in our garden and I suspect the

name helped when we got 'Absolutely Fabulous', 'Lady Marmalade', 'Tickled Pink' and 'For Your Eyes Only'. There was probably name influence for Cotinus 'Young Lady', Clematis 'Pink Flamingo' and Corokia 'Frosted Chocolate'. I had no good reason to buy Begonia 'Bertini' other than we have a Bertini car (you probably have never heard of it). To be fair to all these names, there have been no duds among our purchases.

March is the gardening start time in other respects. I sow the first seeds, starting with radish and carrots in a cold glasshouse, lettuce in tray inserts in a frost-free glasshouse and lobelia and ageratum in warmth. Outside, shallots are planted and the first attack on weeds with Roundup. As the month progresses, onion sets are planted and broad beans and spring onions sown outside, while more bedding is sown indoors. The first early potatoes are then planted and leeks sown in 40 cell tray inserts in a cold glasshouse. I do a few potatoes in a 15 l pot in the glasshouse for the first crop.

March also signals the start of the really busy garden season. In addition to the planting, there is weeding, root pruning bonsai, grooming and perhaps potting on container plants, pruning floribunda roses and checking shrubs and climbers, using moss killer on hard surfaces, checking blackcurrants for big bud and, a serious sign of work to come, the first cutting of grass. ◆

(Continued from page 28) Electoral Roll stated. The recent census suggests that this is not necessarily the case. Others however have to show that they are habitual attenders. The word 'habitual' has been considered in the courts in different scenarios and have usually decided in relation to other features in the case. Nevertheless the ER officer has a duty to strike off the list any non resident who does not habitually attend. Given the expense incurred by the Vicar and PCC in the 1932 case mentioned above, the officer is unlikely to be hasty. Should the Electoral roll officer be called upon to test an applicant's knowledge of the Holy Trinity, he would be well advised to seek the help of a higher authority. Explaining the doctrine of the Holy Trinity strikes dread into the hearts of the clergy: one told me that he always tried to get the Bishop or some similar worthy to preach on Trinity Sunday.

To be on the ER signifies support for the church. Possibly the right of burial is important. The graveyard at St Michael's is closed, although ashes may be interred after a faculty has been obtained, and Haughton has limited space. It is not possible however to reserve a place. There is no cost to being on the Roll, although habitual attending generally assumes some contribution on the plate. It is generally assumed that the PCC should inform everyone on the previous roll that a new roll is being prepared and that if he or she wishes to have their name on the new roll they must apply for enrolment.

At the last enrolment, there were 51 names on the ER, a fraction of those on the roll in 1923. Even in the 1920's the number of names was declining, causing the secretary of the PCC, Rev Owen Jacson, to express his concern for the welfare of the church. This year a new ER has to be prepared. Applicants must be baptised, a lay person and over 16yrs. Those on the ER will be getting letters and others who would like to be included should contact a member of the PCC or the churchwarden by the end of March 2025.♦

CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL

On Thursday 18th April 1923, 40 members, whose names were on the electoral roll of West Felton church, met in the Haslehurst memorial hall to discuss items on the agenda of the first meeting under the enabling bill for Parochial Church Councils (PCCs).

This event, together with other content tells us that Church Electoral rolls (ER) were in existence before 1923 and that members on the electoral roll were entitled to attend the meeting. There were 343 people on the church electoral roll on that date – almost one third of the village.

What does it mean to be on the church electoral roll? Strictly only those on the electoral roll can attend the Annual Parochial church meeting or be on church synodical bodies. Banns of marriage should be read in a church in which the person is on the electoral roll. Presence on the roll confers burial rights in the consecrated ground of that parish. Persons on the electoral roll may be non resident, although they still have to adhere to the regulations. This had importance in the past since it gave that person the right to petition for or object to a faculty application. Clergy and the PCC had divergent views about the number of people on the ER. The clergy liked to have large numbers as it impressed the Archdeacon and the Bishop. The PCC preferred fewer people since the par-

ish share was often proportional to the numbers of the ER. Such conditions no longer apply.

The right to be on an electoral roll has been contested. A famous case in Suffolk in 1932 involved nine persons being removed from the ER by the PCC on the basis that nine neither worshipped in or supported the church. The nine objected. The case was heard by the Bishop who told to PCC to reinstate them. The PCC objected and the case went to the High Court where the PCC were again told to reinstate them. Worse still for the PCC and vicar, they had to pay the appellants' costs.

At present the ER is updated every 6 years. To be on the ER a form has to be completed and returned to the ER officer of the Parish. The most up to date application form merely asks that the applicant has been baptised and is over 16 years of age. Applicants also have to be a member of the Church of England and resident in the parish. Non residents and members of other churches which subscribe to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and who are resident in the parish may also apply to be a on the ER of the parish if they have habitually attended worship in the parish in the last 6 months.

Residents of a parish who are members of the Church of England should have no problem since the Church of England rather condescendingly assumes everyone is C of E unless otherwise
