



WEST FELTON PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Community Speed Watch The October report stated that despite asking for volunteers Council had decided that as the minimum number had not been reached it was not viable to run such a scheme. I would like to thank those parishioners who have since volunteered and we now have just over the minimum number to ensure that the scheme can operate. Can I make another plea for others to join in so we have a good number to run it effectively. The Clerk is now co-ordinating those who have volunteered to pass the project over to the police to move forward.

11th November Remembrance Day The councillors who attended the Poppy Concert, the Church and Cenotaph services were pleased to see so many members of the parish supporting these important events. It was particularly encouraging that so many pupils form our Primary School were in attendance to honour the armed forces members who died in service of their country.

Police Report The report referred to a number of incidents of unacceptable behaviour by some young persons. It is gratifying to see that action was taken with the officers who apprehended the culprits, taking them to apologise for their actions to the upset victims. They then took them back to their parents, carers to whom they reported the nature of the misbehaviour. One youth who was not from the village was told in front of the parents not to return to the village until they learn to behave in an acceptable manner. Many thanks to the PCSOs who were on patrol and took swift and decisive action to protect our parishioners.

It also referred to issues of parking at the school and stated that officers will be making patrols and distributing leaflets to offenders and putting them on cars. Please use the Punch Bowl car park as it is just a short walk from the school.

Shropshire Local Plan Each County Council is required to have a Local Plan which is a document that outlines the planning policies and proposals for the development of an area. Shropshire Council was preparing a Local Plan for the region. Recently inspectors visited the Council to examine it and held a number of hearing sessions to gather evidence. They have since written to the Council as follows: 'We are writing now because we have significant concerns about the soundness of the Plan in respect of a number of areas. We will set these out in detail in a separate letter.'

This means that the Local Plan has been rejected by the inspectors. There is now no possibility of a new plan being adopted before the May elections in 2025.

Neighbourhood Plan Neighbourhood planning is a new way for communities to have a say in the future of the places where they live and work. It gives us the power to produce a plan with real legal weight that directs development in your local area. It helps us:

- choose where we want new homes, shops and offices to be built;
- have our say on what any new buildings should look like;
- grant planning permission for the new buildings;
- direct the Local Plan.

The Council has decided to investigate this matter further particularly now the new government has double housing targets. If you have any comments please contact the Clerk

Public Spaces Protection Order We have had correspondence with Shropshire Council regarding the issue of Dog Fouling and have been offered a number of posters to support the provisions and implementation of the above order. Enforcement will be carried out by Shropshire Council, but there is only one warden for whole County. We expressed our concern that this was far from adequate, particularly as the officer will only work during office hours. Council has agreed to obtain a number of these posters to be displayed in the village.

Conservation Area signs Council has decided to erect signs identifying the area covered by the Conservation Order and is now liaising with Shropshire Council for permissions and support for them.

Correspondence from residents We have received a number of items regarding potholes and speeding on the Rednal road raising the issue of reducing the speed limit on the road. However whilst we agree with the concerns the two issues are matters for Shropshire Council, changes in the speed limit would require Shropshire Council to issue a Traffic Regulation Order. The Council would have to take into consideration factors such as collision history, recorded speeds, whether the road is primarily a through road or local access road, the number of bends & junctions, use of road by vulnerable people and roadside development, as well as carrying out a costs benefit analysis. The following government circular provides useful information on guidance for setting speed limits: https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/setting-local-speed-limits/ setting-local-speed-limits. If anyone wishes a change in speed limit you can make the request directly to the Traffic Management team at traffic.engineering@shropshire.gov.uk.

Traffic Management Programme (CIL) As I reported in the Oct edition we have been pursing our traffic management proposals requiring support from Shropshire Council. I wrote to Chief Executive of Shropshire Council, Andrew Begley who replied 'Thank you for your email and for bringing these matters to my attention. I will request that Mark Barrow, Executive Director, Place, looks at this and ensures you are updated. May I take this opportunity to apologise." I have now received an update from Mark Barrow with profound apologies that the relevant officer had not replied to our correspondence. On 21 Oct I received a reply from



Sp the Earden Path with Topiarius

Keep it simple

I am a great believer in keeping the gardening a simple as possible. I have no time for complicated procedures simply because I don't have the time, or don't want to spend the time, if it can be avoided. It was demonstrated years ago that it doesn't make much difference whether you were fussy over rose pruning or just took a chain saw across the top. I don't actually use the chain saw but I don't think too carefully about where to make the cuts.

A cottage garden may have a multitude of plants but you can't call it complicated because it just happens without a lot of planning. A single en-masse planting is of course as simple as it gets, but is it worth meticulously designing a highly complicated mosaic of plants? I can't say that we have only single plantings or cottage garden confusion, and we do put some thought into our layouts, but they are largely made up as we go along.

No dig is a simplified procedure or perhaps should be called a short cut. However, even with that we have to make a compromise. It is arguably not possible to be completely no dig if you grow potatoes as they can't be harvested without "digging" the soil. Hence, every three years one patch is dug, which has actually been beneficial in the period before we build up sufficient organic matter. We cut down the amount of grass we have several years

ago to reduce the labour of cutting, scarifying and aerating and have not regretted it.

Then there is the advice to not use weedkiller, to hand pick caterpillars from the brassica and build barriers for slugs and snails. These may have laudable aims and be feasible in a small space, but is simply not possible in a large garden without an army of gardeners, so we have to take more short cuts. Hand weeding becomes essential between vegetables so we do our best but even so we usually fail to keep up. Dead heading is another time consuming occupation so it is best to severely restrict the number of plants for which it is essential.

We are now into winter and can expect weather to restrict outdoor activities. However, one important job is the spreading of soil conditioner on the vegetable plots and some borders, and this can go ahead whenever the ground is not frozen. The other large job is pruning climbing roses, shrubs and trees. On the grounds of simplicity and reducing labour you could perhaps restrict your choice of shrubs to those that need no or minimal pruning. But that is taking simplicity too far and I for one have completely ignored that advice to the extent that winter pruning is a major occupation for us. However, having realised the error of our ways we are now completely removing some of the things that grow far too big for the available space. ♦

Local health champion publishes report into the experiences of living with cancer in Shropshire.

In their latest report into healthcare the local health champion Healthwatch Shropshire has highlighted the experiences of people living with cancer in the county.

Healthwatch Shropshire has been visiting groups across Shropshire to speak to cancer patients, their families and those who support them about their experiences while also asking others to share their feedback through a survey. They heard from nearly 400 people who shared their views on what is working well, what is not working so well and their suggestions for improvements.

People also shared their views on what would support people to live with and beyond cancer, these included:

- More personalised support from medical professionals to help patients access information about their condition, treatment and support available.

- Improved clinical support for patients after diagnosis, treatment / discharge.
- Improved access to additional emotional/wellbeing support.



Carers who have to look after disabled, dying or suffering patients themselves are affected and efforts to hasten death often descend into cruelty. Rotation of staff is important. For relatives there may be no escape and their needs also must be met.

Financial decisions may also affect a decision to hasten an end of life. It is possibly this area that gives the greatest concern since the well-being of the patient may become less significant. Relatives of patients may be anxious for introducing the concept of the Quality the patient to die in order to inherit their fortune. More frequently relatives crave an end in order to relieve themselves of the burden of care. This may also be financial as care homes are expensive. Ways to deal with the needs of the dying, the care of exhausted relatives and carers, and the cost will form

a critical part of the debate.

Another concern is what might be described as the "positive negative" approach. Essentially this means actively doing nothing. Doctors used to quote the verse:" Do not kill, but do not strive, officiously, to keep alive". Of greater trepidation to the politicians is the voting public. Voters may be in favour of hospice care or paid carer support until everyone is asked to pay an extra tax to support the model. The state has in effect put the "positive negative" approach into practice by Adjusted life year (QALY). Essentially no patient can receive a new drug if the cost exceeds £30,000 per QALY. Whatever an individual's feelings are about Assisted Dying, the issue raises a host of questions. Ultimately public opinion will decide and moral questions may fade before the tide of finance. •

ASSISTED DYING BILL

A bill is due in parliament shortly seeking to legalise assisted dying. This will prove controversial, not only for moral reasons but also because of issues over whether assisted dying can be not only a positive action but also a positive inaction.

Sponsoring such a bill opens a minefield. Should assisted dving be confined to terminal cases or also include incurable cases? If terminal, then how long should that be? Doctors have enough of a problem trying to forecast how long someone is likely to live. To have to put that forecast into a positive action requires considerable fortitude as well as protection against being sued in the future. The hospice movement is also an interested party in that the movement believes that they are capable of minimising suffering. In bygone days a General Practitioner, often in association with the local vicar, would counsel the family with suffering being eased by increasing amounts of morphine. Unfortunately one or two unhappy episodes dating from Dr John Bodkin Adams in the 1950's and Dr Harold Shipman more recently have betraved that trust.

The Church of England is entering into the debate carefully. The Archbishop of Canterbury has come out against any such measure: other senior clergy have expressed support. A position paper published some eight years ago emphasizes the rights of the individual and castigates use of quality of life questionnaires to identify those who qualify for assisted dying. In supporting the current law, the Church of England notes the importance of caring support for the dying and supports the hospice movement. In effect the Church is asking for a personalised treatment of every dying person, not a production line. The Church believes that life is too precious to let go. The Church also underlines the importance of taking into account the relatives and others, which may itself be contentious, as discussed later.

Apart from a debate about how long a patient might live, questions also arise about what kind of suffering should qualify for assisted dying. Someone in great pain may cry out to be relieved; often the condition is terminal and the loss of a few days may not be important. However others suffer not so much from pain but from an inability to conduct a day to day existence. Motor neurone disease is the classical example of this dilemma. Patients may have a long time to live but the quality of life is important.

Whilst the patient is the most important consideration in the argument, the effect on relatives, carers and others of a chronically suffering patient must not be overlooked. Looking after patients who have no hope of improvement requires special attention to the personality of the carer and the time over which the carer is asked to care. Both these aspects have not been properly studied and is one of the criti-



Income in 2024 is expected to be approximately £4,465 so you will see the need for an increase in income next year.

The operating costs of our web site <u>westfeltonmagazine.co.uk</u> are marginal but have increased in 2024 by £36 pa. Otherwise, claimed expenses cover only the most expensive consumables: most of the day-to-day expense, petrol etc. is absorbed by the volunteers.

Full Page £150, half page £90 and quarter page £60 for 12 insertions.
