



This was the first meeting of our new year. We welcomed two new Councillors Neil Summers and Nick Greene. I hope they enjoy their time with us and am sure from their backgrounds they will make a positive contribution. We also congratulate Councillor David Walker on his election as a Shropshire County Councillor. This now brings us up to our full complement of 11 Councillors.

It was a very business orientated meeting with a number of formal agreements to be made. With a full complement we have now regained our general Power of Competence which provides more flexibility and confidence for us to act in your best interests. We also re-confirmed a range of policies.

We also appointed various councillors and Council agreed not to hold a to represent you on other important meeting with the developers. bodies as follows:

Conservation Area signs. We are still

negotiating about the placement of signs despite previous requests. We will continue to press for a site visit to agree the placement of signs and other road safety matters.

Flooding in West Felton near Tedsmore Road. In the April edition I commented on the response from John Bellis of Shropshire Council to our unease regarding continued flooding. The Clerk wrote to him expressing the Members' surprise and concern regarding the pipe being only 9 inches, with a request for his thoughts. So far, we have not received a reply.

#### **Housing Development West Felton.**

With regard to last month's report the Clerk received further detailed information. This was fully discussed and Council agreed not to hold a meeting with the developers.

**Punch Bowl.** In the last report I referred to a letter the Council had received from Mark Brown - Managing Director of Trust Inns stating:

"I am the Managing Director of Trust Inns, the owner of the Punchbowl. Please excuse the directness but I have been given this email address by Sally, the tenant of the pub, to make contact with you in relation to the potential sale of the land at the pub

(Continued from page 7)Parish Council report to the Parish Council. If there is indeed interest, then I look forward to hearing from you with any proposal."

The Council replied asking Trust Inns to provide further details of exactly what it is that was being proposed so that members could consider it. We have not received anything further.

Fox Lane Footpath. We can report that the concerns about the blocking of a footpath are now resolved.

Rednal Battery Plant. Council have received a planning application for the erection of a battery storage plant at Rednal. There was a full discussion and it was agreed to oppose the application for a number of reasons. There was a large amount of documentation, but it was noted that there was no reasoned argument for the construction of such a plant and why that site was appropriate. The scale of the proposed plant was considered significantly large and this would affect site lines and create visual pollution in such a country area. Council considered the real fire risks as other similar plants elsewhere have gone on fire. In these instances, it took some time to extinguish them and the fall out was widespread with real risks of pollution. We will consult with Fire department officials for further advice. Construction would take up to twelve months and members were concerned about the impact

and damage on the Rednal straight road from heavy construction vehicles and cranes over such a long period of time. The plant will operate day and night and the decibel levels indicated in the plan would be continuous and high at all times creating noise pollution. There will be large cooling fans running all the times of day and night but there does not seem to be any relevant or detailed proposal for mitigating sound pollution.

If you wish to make your own representations then you can do so in the **Shropshire Council planning alloca**tions site using the Ref no 25/01250/ FUL. The closing date for your views is 28th May 2025.

Fox Lane Bus Shelter. We had received complaints about damage. Our window cleaner has visited the site but cannot establish the cause of the damage but advised that it cannot be repaired. Council has agreed to replace the relevant panel.

WI Projector. We have received an email of thanks for the funding of a new projector screen for the Village Hall.

Defibrillator. When the defibrillator was installed, training was provided for members to be able to operate it. It is now time to renew that training as this must be undertaken every two

To begin with, he's aiming to show films Thursday to Sunday, with a mix of the latest box-office sellers, classics, and independent productions.

The Oswestry Film Society (OFS), which has kept live cinema going in the town on Wednesday nights since the old Kinokulture closed, will continue to be involved in the film scheduling. OFS chairman James Bond said, "The loyal and enthusiastic audience that's supported us has shown there's definitely a desire for big-screen cinema in Oswestry and round about."



## Sp the Earden Path with Topiarius

39

A Real Question

Somebody gave me a book of the 1000 most asked gardening questions, which reminded me of my suspicion as to whether many of the questions in gardening magazines are real or made up, because they often seem so simple. Perhaps the great majority of people who send questions to magazines are complete beginners. It also reminded me of a Which? Article that asked readers what jobs they would give a garden robot if they had one. As you would expect, there was a variety of answers but the one I empathise with is to put the robot on permanent weeding duty. This is perhaps particularly salient for this time of year as it is when weeding can become a rather depressing uphill fight. The other side to the simple questions is the answers, and here I have to say that I do not always agree with the magazine experts.

Also at this time of year, I never know whether to be pleased if we get a long spell of hot dry weather or to be displeased because it will mean a lot of watering. In preparation for this year, I did some rearrangement of hoses which included getting a hose reel rather than having to coil it up after use. This should ease the job if only a little. What stopped me getting a reel years ago? Presumably either a blind spot or expense. Actually, we had to do some watering in the dry spell in April this year which was probably what triggered getting the hose reel.

June is of course when, except in a freak year, it is safe to plant out tender bedding and vegetables, although I admit to starting with courgettes and squash a little earlier if there are no dire forecasts. Inside, I will be planting tomato and cucumber plants and sowing sweetcorn in modules. Outside, it is time to sow runner beans which I do in situ and, if you sowed brassica and leaks in trays, they will probably be ready to be planted out. June is also a good time to sow beetroot and chard. Other jobs include putting support for broad beans, spreading Growmore, taking cuttings and dealing with aphids and caterpillars. After all that work. there will be the pleasure of harvesting the first potatoes.

The so-called June gap is because there can be a shortage of nectar and pollen so that bees have a hard time. From herbs through fruit and vegetables to shrubs the garden can help allay this problem—and we need the bees. It is noticeable that the garden has "thickened" up as shrubs and trees in particular have filled the spaces between leaves and branches. The only bare earth to be seen is probably where there is newly planted bedding or land waiting for vegetables. At the same time, the garden still has a certain freshness and we approach the longest day—make the most of it. •

#### Who's to provide spiritual sustenance and comforting rituals?

Last month's article related to ways of funding the Church of England, suggesting that processes might change. Times do change and there has recently been an upsurge in interest in Christianity amongst people in their twenties. This interest is more marked in young men than in young women and seems to hold both in America and in England.

Surveys, notably in the Exeter Diocese, have sought to identify what younger people seek in Christianity. Young people have not been brought up with religion. Those now of pensionable age, when young, were often taken to church on a Sunday and this became a habit, much like brushing your teeth in the morning. We sang hymns, listened to a gospel, learnt a bit about what it meant if the sermon was any good, and avoided congratulating the vicar on a good sermon in case we gave the impression that some sermons did not come up to scratch.

Younger people have not had this introduction and their opinions must give rise to anxiety amongst the priesthood. Younger people tend to look for guidance from the New Testament alone. Hardly any survey finds younger people mentioning the Old

Testament. Those that do, regard it as a history of the Jews, and God anyway is not always terribly nice. Instead they look for a loving God, want to enjoy a community spirit and seek Justice in the world. Many of the teachings of Christ resonate with them. The Church's one foundation may be Jesus Christ Our Lord, but to the young, incarnation, death on the Cross and the Resurrection are not matters worthy of attention.

Changes in how people wish to receive a spiritual presence are not a new phenomenon. Earlier articles have highlighted the splits of the Eastern Church, the Reformation and the rise of Methodism. Even Catholicism struggles between the conservatives and the progressives. The late Pope was heard to guip when a 'minder' remonstrated with him for accepting a drink from a pilgrim, suggesting that it might be poisoned, that this would be alright because "it was offered by a pilgrim, not by a Cardinal". Those people who today are seeking spiritual comfort are less concerned with procedure than with Christ's message about how to treat people. The materialism of present day life may have reached a satisfactory level at least in Western society. Poverty is always with us because of the way it is defined, but 19th Century conditions are history.

(Continued from page 23 - Who's to provide ... ing spiritual sustenance cite loneliness, lack of feeling of being associated with a community and a desire for people not to be ill-treated, as matters of concern to them. They feel that just doing a job is not fulfilling and that they want more out of life. Although these feelings predated the Covid pandemic, it is likely that for many people the enforced isolation associated with lockdown has led to a mind-set of isolation and then depression. The effect appears to be more marked in males than females. The ability to occupy the mind with computer games reinforces isolation. Before this occupying time with board games or team games did bring people into contact with each other.

How can therefore the Church of today respond? It is likely that there will be less demand for the traditional clergy with a parish, although the pensioner age group and weddings and funerals will need to be considered. Over the years the church, in common with other organisations, has established a ritual of worship for which younger people do not necessarily see a need. Efforts to make the church more accessible to novices have been tried. The Oswestry Rural

Youth Church is a good example. The idea was good, but it failed because there was no structure to carry it on when the leaders left. The hierarchy probably regarded it as an interesting passage and carried on their old ways. Christ was rather savage with the money lenders and overturned the tables in the temple. Should the structure of the church be overhauled? Social workers might be more valuable than ordained clergy – at least in the first instance. Ordained clergy could come in later, once the loneliness had been overcome and a community built, to provide spiritual sustenance. Later, some may find the rituals of Christianity satisfying and comforting.

Back now to last month's article. How will this be funded? The church has always been dependent on the Church Commissioners and the elderly in the congregations. The funds of the former will need re-directing and the latter will need to be looked after by ordained clergy. These same clergy could provide the spiritual sustenance for the youngsters as noted above. This would require clergy capable of doing two very different rôles. Is the church capable of such an upheaval?

"The youth of today are the leaders of tomorrow." This quote, attributed to Nelson Mandela, emphasizes the importance of nurturing and investing in young people, as they will shape the future. It highlights the belief that young people hold the potential to lead and make a positive impact.

#### Remembering VE Day 80 Years On



## Mrs Mabel Jones, Land Girl, Nurse and organist.

Mable Jones lived in Ironbridge and had planned a career in nursing. However, circumstances at the beginning of the war curtailed this ambition and Mable joined the Women's Land Army.

"I was sent to Baschurch, to Mr. Slater's farm. I lived with the family and my first job was lugging muck with a cart and horse, at that time there was no tractor. It was several weeks before I got any uniform. When it did arrive there were khaki dungarees, Aertex shirts and wellingtons for work, and breeches, green sweater, up to the knee stockings and

brown shoes and overcoat and hat for special occasions. For each year of service we had a triangle red patch to stitch on our green arm band."

"On the farm it was up by 8am, help with the milking, hand done, then breakfast. My job after was to take the milk in churns to Ruyton dairy with pony and float. In the winter when there was ice on the roads we had to fit studs into the pony's shoes. Afterwards I had to work with the men, pitching and loading alternately, hay or corn in season, pulling beet, turnips or mangles or lugging muck, often with two horses. Another job was to start the Tangey engine to pump the water to the house, and in the winter grind the mangles and turnips for feeding the cattle, this was mixed with corn, linseed slabs which had to be ground as well. After harvest, the corn had to be threshed by the visiting thresher, this was a horrible job, especially when it was barley or clover. In winter I had to transport feed for the sheep, often through deep snow, winters were severe then. One year the branches were so frozen they broke off the trees and once, the birds were frozen on the wires.

Mr. Slater at that time, farmed Boreatton Park, since no land could be wasted. I had to take corn up there for the sheep and at that time was driving the float with a very skittish long tailed pony, more used to being ridden. On the way to Boreatton I often met Dame Agnes Hunt being driven to the Orthopaedic from her home at Old Boreatton. She once asked who was driving that `Flying Wheelbarrow". *Thank you, Mable for these evocative memories of a life on the land during World War II.*

#### **Land Girls - Lumber Jills**




The Women's Land Army representatives for Oswestry were Miss A Howes, Woodhill, Oswestry and Mrs Kempster of Oldport Farm, Oswestry.


The late Mrs Frances Rowley (nee Jones) of Milloon Farm, West Felton, was a land girl; here she is on the left with her sister, Alice.

The Women's Timber Corps was a separate branch of the Women's Land Army started in 1942 due to the German occupation of Norway causing a shortage of imported timber. They were called Lumber Jills. Lumber Jills undertook a range of roles: felling, pole selection, pitprop preparation, haulage, and sawmilling, measuring, census and stock taking.

## Mrs Dorothy (Dolly) Jones, late of Holyhead Road was a Lumber Jill.



This branch received even less recognition than the Women's Land Army. The WTC uniform was slightly different. Lumber Jills had a beret instead of a hat and a different arm band. Their badge showed a fir tree, as opposed to the sheaf of wheat for the Women's Land Army. In this type of work, the women worked along-side men who had to teach them everything, from how to chop a tree, through to how to load it onto a lorry. The work didn't just include the wielding of an axe, but also the skilled work of measuring trees and undertaking administrative work out in the forests.



Lumber Jills worked from 7am to 4:30 – slightly shorter compared to the girls on the fields. However, as part of the interview process, Lumber Jills had to pass a stricter medical examination

than Land Girls. They worked in difficult physical conditions and showed strength, skill and stamina. Undertaking what was thought to be 'a man's job', these pioneering women brought gender stereotypes crashing down.



#### **REDNAL AEROROME - No. 61 Officer Training Unit**

Being far from operations in the South and East of Britain meant Rednal was ideally situated as a base for training pilots with a satellite at Montford Bridge.

The aerodrome was so isolated that the RAF had to persuade the Great Western Railway to run a special train each evening to Shrewsbury and arrange for the Paddington-Birkenhead express to stop at Rednal station so that airmen could get back after a night on the town.

The Officer Training Unit (OUT) in the event of an emergency could rapidly be turned into an operational squadron. The only time this occurred was on 27th June 1943 when eight Spitfires were scrambled to intercept a JU 88 which was reported to be over the Irish Sea but, much to their disappointment, no contact was made with the enemy aircraft!

Pilots of many different nationalities attended courses at Rednal, including many who were to become aces, such as Pierre Closterman. Born in Brazil in 1921, **Pierre Closterman** joined the Free French Forces, he trained on Spitfires at Rednal. He had a total of 33 air victories, won during 293 long-range offensive war missions, 97 assault and dive bombing missions and 42 defensive fighter missions.

The accident rate of the old Battle of Britain planes was very high and mid-air collisions were common.

Wing Commander Wilkerson 27, a passenger on a flight from Rednal, died on 16th September 1944.



He was a survivor of 46 bombing operations as a Halifax pilot.

This well-kept memorial is on the Tedsmore Estate.

#### REDNAL AIR AMBULANCE

Rednal was selected as a military hospital for the receipt of casualties direct from the battle front. Personnel from the US Army Medical Service were attached to assist with the evacuation. The first C-47 - the 'Model T Ford of the Skies' - arrived from an airstrip in Normandy on 3rd July 1944 and flights went on throughout July. They included wounded German as well as allied personnel. During August, seventy-seven C-47s flew in about 1,750 men before the evacuation ceased.

On the morning of 18th February 1945 an airman found a German prisoner of war sitting in the cockpit of a Mustang on one of the remote dispersals. The German, who had escaped from a camp at Oswestry the previous evening, gave himself up without a fight although he was found to have in his possession a bag of black pepper and a sharp knife.

#### On 16th June 1945 the 61 OTU moved to Keevil in Wiltshire.

Despite their initial misgivings about the remoteness of Rednal, the permanent staff had grown to like the place and were sorry to leave behind their three sports fields - cricket, rugby and football!

After some time as a care and maintenance base, Rednal was sold in 1962. Its very isolation has meant the wartime aerodrome is something of a time capsule, suffering virtually no damage or vandalism.
