

Report from West Felton Parish Chairman, Cllr John Thornhill

Shropshire Local Plan. Section 3 of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) requires that each local planning authority should prepare a Local Plan for its area. The document guides decisions on future development and topics usually covered include housing, employment, setting out what the opportunities are for development in the area and what types of development will and will not be permitted and in which locations. They are at the heart of the planning system and are the main consideration in deciding planning applications. They set the framework in which decisions on particular planning applications are taken locally. In a recent letter from the relevant

In a recent letter from the relevant inspectors regarding the proposed Shropshire Local Plan it was stated that 'we note that you now accept that work is needed to identify a new strategic employment site allocation for Shrewsbury, and to identify a new allocation(s) to accommodate the proposed 1,500 dwelling and 30ha employment land contributions to the Black Country.' However it expressed several serious concerns and recommended that the proposed Local Plan be withdrawn and a new one prepared.

The impact of this significant delay is that as there is now no Local Plan and Shropshire Council will have no control to direct the location of development, house sizes, affordability or compel

developers to deliver infrastructure. Planning applications may well increase as developers can go for development anywhere, without limit on the numbers. Our area could now find an increase in applications for developments without any real check on the suitability of them.

Neighbourhood Plan. Council had previously proposed the publication of such a plan, and at our March meeting to wait until there was clarity about the availability of government funding to support development. Such a plan would help us oppose unreasonable applications for development in the Parish in the absence of a Shropshire Local Plan. A working group would be established to prepare the proposals for this development and must include members of the community who are not Councillors. If any member of the Parish would be willing to join such a group then please let the Clerk know. **Planned Road Resurfacing.** Council received a letter indicating proposals to resurface Mains Street, Queens Head. We responded but saying we welcome resurfacing work but questioned why that stretch of road had been chosen when there are far worse roads in the area with deep potholes particularly the Queens Head to Rednal straight. We await a response. Conservation Area signs. We are still negotiating about the placement of signs despite previous correspond-

ence. We will continue to press for a site visit to agree effective placements and discuss other matters.

Community Speed Watch. In the Police Report to March Council our Police Liaison Officer states 'I have not received any further requests to join the scheme.' We still need volunteers to enable this scheme to be fully effective. If you would be interested please let the Clerk know. The report also included results of a speed survey in Queens Head which stated – 'The average speed was under 30mp (just)! The majority of those spoken to regarding being over the limit were coming from West Felton into Queens Head and were ALL FROM THE VILLAGE. This time it was education rather than prosecution as I was on my own. Next time it might be the speed camera van or motorbike which is even harder to spot.'

Green GEN Cymru The Council discussed the project to set up electric power lines near the village. It was agreed that a response to the consultation should be made to cover:

- i. the exact location of the Sub Station And last but not least, the speed to ensure minimum disruption to awareness sign. When will this b towns and villages in Shropshire; fixed? We have noticed PCSO Mo
- ii. the fact Government subsidies will be paid out they will not be given to Shropshire even though the Pylons and lines may well be within Shropshire County boundaries;
- iii. serious consideration be given to the necessity to use more underground installations to avoid damag-

ing the environment;

iv. the fact that changes to the design of the proposed pylons to reduce height would mean the maximum voltage carried by these smaller pylons would be reduced. This would lead to the need for a second run of pylons to carry the load with further adverse impact on the environment within Shropshire.

Bins, street lights and VAS sign. We have received the following letter from a local resident:

"I would like to highlight the rubbish which seems to be increasing in and around the hedgerow and footpath from Queens Head to West Felton. Could we have any more litter bins? places for example at the junction of Twyford road and the large lay-by coming into West Felton would certainly help with this situation as we only have ONE litter bin in Queens Head by the bus shelter.

Also street lighting. Majority of the lights are white however there's ONE that is blue any reasons for this? as its not in keeping with the rest of the hamlet and can be very distracting. And last but not least, the speed awareness sign. When will this be fixed? We have noticed PCSO Mabe a few times over the weekend traffic calming which was great to see however this has been a rare occasion and the speed awareness sign did deter traffic. The above are valid points to consider in keeping our hamlet a cleaner, safer, place to live in and I hope

something can be put in place to help as soon as possible."

The Clerk has responded to this letter and Council discussed it. We will keep it an eve on this situation but it may not be pedestrians dropping the litter. We are aware that a considerate parishioner does go out around that area picking up the rubbish. Can I, on behalf of the Council, thank him very much for his thoughtfulness and community spirit. The Women's Institute also has litter collecting kits if anyone else wishes to become involved.

As regards the blue light this was raised last November with the contractor and the Clerk has already sought an update. It is the duty of Shropshire County to fix the speed sign at Queens Head and is apparently on their work schedule. Our Clerk has chased it up several times without any action.

Flooding in West Felton. The Council wrote to John Bellis of Shropshire Council to express unease regarding continued flooding. As reported last month a response was received which stated 'Shropshire Council are aware of

the flooding. Following the last event our tanker team jetted the highway drain under Holyhead Road which appeared to clear a blockage which then drained the flood. We are now looking to arrange a CCTV survey of this section of drain to see if there is a defect causing the issue. I believe this is programmed for next week. $(12^{th} - 16^{th})$ Feb)' We responded asking for the outcome from this survey but have not received any response.

Football Pitch. We have responded to a letter received late January from Balfours re the land for the football pitch but are still awaiting a reply.

Footbridge over A5 at Fox Lane. We have received information that yet another parishioner has slipped on the bridge at Fox lane. We had contacted Shropshire Council to ask them to implement the promise they gave five years ago to re-surface it but have not received any response so far.

Annual Parish Meeting. It is proposed to hold this meeting on Tuesday 20th May 2025 at 7:30pm in the School. We had invited the local MP, Helen Morgan, to attend, but she has now said she is unavailable due to Parliamentary Business.

legal advisers to the church were of the opinion that an independent body would make it difficult for the Church to follow Charity law. Charities have to be responsible for their own behaviour including Safeguarding. This realisation led to the adoption of the first option. It also caused the hearts of church people outside the synod to miss a beat.

The implementation of Safeguarding by the Church of England has had significant effects on church members. All members of the parochial church council have to undergo safeguarding training. Much of this is largely common sense. The definition of abuse however is guite wide and the knowledge of possible abuse places an obligation on that person to alert a safeguarding officer. Each Benefice has a more profound change is required in a safeguarding officer and there is a Diocesan team as well. It is realised that any accusation must be investigated to avoid any damage to individuals or the organisation. Such a procedure is worthwhile, but there are shortcom-

ings. People are increasingly reluctant to take on responsible posts. Clergy are fearful of visiting lest they be accused of abuse. From this follows the complaint that people never see their clergy. The problem will exacerbate come 2030 when individual parishes each becomes a charity. This clears up an oversight when the Charity commission was set up. Parishes were overlooked, but became charities outside the Commission. What this means in practice is that PCC members will become liable for safeguarding indiscretions. Whereas the Church now pays compensation, the individual PCCs may be liable. Hence the missed heart beat as people considered how this might be handled.

Although safeguarding receives much attention at present, it may signify that the way that the Church of England operates. It may need to become a more professional organisation, more attuned to serve the requirements of the people it seeks to attract.

SAFEGUARDING

To say that religious organisations have trouble with safeguarding is to understate the problem. In America alone it is estimated that the Catholic Church has paid out about \$3 billion to people affected by clerical abuse

The history of child protection could be said to have started in the 19th Century. In the 1830's various Factory Acts were introduced, often linked with Antony Ashley Cooper, later 7th Earl of Shaftesbury. These prevented the employment of children, initially under 9yr but later increased, from working in factories or mines. Almost 200 years ago a 12 hr day was the maximum. Today children cannot take on a full time job until the age of 16yr and then only 40hr per week are allowed.

Prevention of child abuse came on the scene rather later, the first report coming in 1945 following the death of a child at the hands of his foster father. This led to changes in fostering legislation. It wasn't until 1973 following the death of another child that child protection as we know it today started to be implemented. Since the millennium, reports have multiplied with over 20 appearing in the last 25 years. Along with abuse of children, abuse of women and to a lesser extent men has become more widely publicised. It is important to emphasize 'publicised' since such behaviour was

previously swept under the carpet.

Religious faiths have not been immune from such behaviour. It is important to note that abuse has been noted not only in Christian churches, but in other religions as well. Christian churches have however had the greatest publicity. They have in the past not helped themselves by failing to acknowledge that such behaviour exists. One report relates that a mother complained to a vicar that a member of the church had abused her child. She was told that the child must be making it up since the said individual was a worthy and valued member of the church.

Somewhat belatedly churches, including the Church of England, have started to set up Safeguarding procedures which have had both positive and negative effects. The Church of England recently debated how a new Safeguarding system should be set up. There were two alternatives. One proposed that the Church would have a safeguarding team that the Church owned. The other suggested that the Church would pay for an entirely independent safeguarding team with no association with the church. The debate continued for several hours with the Bishop in charge of safeguarding speaking in favour of the independent solution. This option was also strongly favoured by those who had been the subject of abuse. At this point the spectre of the Charity Commission settled over the whole debate. The

WEST MERCIA POLICE ECONOMIC CRIME UNIT TELEPHONE FRAUD

The number of "Nuisance" calls has risen in recent years from 21% to 40%, and according to OFGEN, nearly 40% of Scams start with a phone call.

Older persons may be particularly vulnerable as they rely on their phones for contact and companionship, so it is helpful to make elderly relatives aware of the dangers of cold callers.

These calls involve fraudsters trying to gain your personal and financial information, and are often referred to as "Vishing" – an amalgamation of "Voice" and "Phishing".

Very often the fraudster has disguised their call identity by using an apparently legitimate number so appearing genuine; this is known as "Spoofing". If you do receive a call from a company which is not expected then just hang up, and do not engage with that caller.

Common Phone Call Scams

Technical Support scams - They may impersonate a company such as Microsoft or BT, and tell you there is a fault on your computer or Broadband. They then probably will ask you to download remote access software to gain access to your computer, or else install Malware on your computer.

Impersonation Scams - Typically these may claim to come from your "Bank Fraud Department" telling you that your account or bank cards have been compromised and you need to transfer money to another so-called Safe Account, from where it vanishes. Similarly, calls may come from fraudsters masquerading as a Police Officer, Utility Provider, HMRC or DVLA.

Prize Draw Scams – "You have won the Lottery or a Prize Draw!" Sounds good but is it? You may think you never entered the competition but they will convince you that you have, then ask for your bank details so you can "receive" the prize.

Financial Scams – you are called with tempting offers for investing your money in funds, schemes or perhaps in Bitcoins with the promise of huge returns. Since 2019, it has been illegal to make cold calls to sell Pension schemes, so any calls about Pension Schemes will be scams. This scheme may be extended in the future to ban any unsolicited financial cold call.

How can you stay safe?

Never give out your financial information over the phone, and just hang up if you are unsure about the caller's identity

Register for "TPS" - Telephone Preference Service - this prevents bona fide companies cold calling you, so you will then know that any cold call is a fake.

Many modern landline handsets have a "Call Blocking" feature so unwanted numbers can be added to the list of Blocked Callers

Similarly many phone service providers can offer other call blocking services such as BT Call Guardian

Scammers will often keep the phone line open after the call so even when you think you are calling a legitimate number you are still speaking to the fraudster. Wait for up to 15 minutes or make the call using a different phone line or mobile.

Op the Earden Path with Topiarius

Here is Spring

I have no doubt that we are experiencing climate change that includes warming. However, the swings and roundabouts of our weather are such that we do not experience a uniform trend. This year there were reports of the warmest month ever and Which? Gardening ran an article that suggested that Spring was getting earlier, although there were signs that the rate of change was slowing. One personal experience this year points to the opposite—our apricot was a good week later to come into flower this year than last year. Presumably a swing or roundabout. Nevertheless, by April we can reasonably expect that Spring will be well and truly sprung and most things in the garden will have started into life. Having nothing to do with that except that it has woken up after the winter is that our Black Hamburg vine is 50 years old this year. Not guite sure how to celebrate that.

Our garden generally is of an age when every winter there is a list of oversize shrubs and trees that need severely cutting back or removing. Among the sacrifices this last winter was a very old and very large Berberis atropurpurea. It started with a severe cutting back but developed into complete removal. Only those who have removed a very large berberis will know the difficulty. First, any tree or shrub is always a lot bigger after cutting down than it appeared when intact. Secondly, a berberis pre-

sents the problem that it combines being very prickly with the branches knitting together to form a sort of giant spiky bird's nest. Demolition started with a chain saw and then went through stages of hedge trimmer, loppers and secateurs before it was reduced to bonfire sized pieces. I won't be removing another one in a hurry.

There are quite a lot of seeds that get sown in April, starting with more annuals such as Dahlia, nicotiana, calendula and cosmos that will be started in tray inserts indoors. Also to be sown indoors are tomatoes, cucumbers, courgette and squash. Outdoors, I will be continuing with more potatoes, radish, watercress and broad beans. Later in the month there will be swede, while I prefer to sow sprouts and sprouting broccoli in tray inserts in a cold frame. In fact, it could be agued that there are not a lot of things that cannot be sown in April.

A major job at the beginning of the month is to scarify and treat the grass with lawn sand start regular mowing and feeding. Two things I couldn't do last year at this time was strim the grass on the river bank and uncover the gunnera because they were still under water from winter flooding. I hope that is not repeated. If you keep your brassica plants under netting as I do then it is time to clear the remains of last year's crop and set the frame in its new location.
